Unusual Tariffs and Tariff Threats In the US Trade Regime

- Section 232 adjusting imports found to threaten national security
- Section 201 safeguard measures enjoying a minirenaissance
- Section 301 bilateral pressure and retaliation
- IEEPA bilateral pressure vs. Mexico, immigration-themed



China Section 301 Proceeding -- Current Status --

- Underlying Chinese acts/policies/practices involving tech and IP
- Four US tariff lists
 - List 1: \$34B of imports from China 25% tariffs in effect since July 6
 - List 2: \$16B of imports from China 25% tariffs in effect since August 23
 - List 3: \$200B of imports from China 10% (could become 25%) tariffs in effect since Sept 24
 - List 4 now proposed; includes Li-ION batteries 8507.60.00
 - Exclusion process(es) potential for relief at 10-digit level
- Other components of USG response investment restrictions, WTO litigation, heightened export regulation
- China's counter-retaliatory actions



China Section 301 Proceeding -- Trajectory --

- Govt-to-govt engagement
 - Has broadened to include numerous elements in bilateral relationship
 - Is currently stalled in recriminatory atmosphere
 - Differing views on what USG is truly aiming to achieve and by when
- List 3 tariffs
 - Increase to 25% is pending
 - Exclusion process (at 10-digit level) expected to launch if this happens
- List 4 tariffs
 - Going through public comment process
 - Removals not achieved at 8-digit level may be difficult to achieve at 10-digit level
 - Li-ION batteries have two 10-digit breakouts, for vehicle batteries and for "other"



Other Trump Tariff Measures -- Section 232 --

- Debate over national security rationale
- Trading partner retaliation
 - Without waiting for DS results
 - Reaction to shifting US rationales
- Institutional issues
 - Run by the U.S. Department of Commerce's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS)
 - Country exclusion process has appeared chaotic
- Product Exclusion Process
 - Importer-specific; massive volume of requests, slow processing
 - DOC is not approving exclusions that have domestic industry opposition
- Next up: autos?



Other "Trump Tariff" Measures -- Section 201 Safeguards --

- Rationale
- Measures in force
 - Solar equipment
 - Washing machines
- Trading partner responses
 - WTO Members
 - NAFTA parties
- More to come?



Other New Elements in the US Trade Agenda

- NAFTA \rightarrow USMCA
- Absence of other FTA negotiations
- Pressure tactics aimed at WTO
- Incentivizing more trade remedy filings
 - Handling of current case load
 - New regulations addressing, for example, currency subsidies
- Broader fusion of trade policy and national security policy
- In Congress: preparation to overhaul the US trade regime's basic plumbing?
